Ancient Tea and Horse Road

Summer 2020: August 22 - 27



Destination Northern Yunnan



Located just east of the Himalayas, Northern Yunnan's mountain scenery is some of the most spectacular in the world. For centuries, the rugged terrain shielded local people from the Han-dominated empires of China's past, helping to insulate and preserve the greatest number of minority cultures of any region in China.

We call this program "The Tea and Horse Road", because each of the locations we explore were part of that ancient trade route which, for nearly 1000 years, connected the peoples of Southwest China.

During our adventure on this tea and horse road participants will tackle arduous terrain and interact with local communities. Each day, participants will have the opportunity to participate in carefully designed activities that are sure to bring new challenges, new flavors, new stories, and new friends. From the breathtaking views of Tiger Leaping Gorge to friendly villagers around Shaxi, participants are sure to experience China like never before and take home a new, unique perspective of the Middle Kingdom.



What you'll be working on Key Concepts

PHYSICAL CHALLENGE

How might we learn more about ourselves by testing our perceived physical boundaries?

Northern Yunnan offers the opportunity to challenge ourselves physically. Whether it's hiking the legendary Tiger Leaping Gorge, cycling the valleys of Shaxi, or trekking to the ancient grottoes of Shibaoshan, Northern Yunnan is a grand adventure that requires participants to step outside their perceived physical comfort zones to experience the natural beauty of this rugged region.



CULTURE & IDENTITY

How might we better understand different cultures by engaging with the people of Northern Yunnan?

In Northern Yunnan, participants will become acquainted with the customs, the languages, and the values of its ethnic minorities. They'll venture far from the beaten path, gaining both a deep appreciation China's vast cultural diversity, as well as an understanding of the shared values which connect the region's unique communities.

GEOGRAPHY & TRADE

How can we understand the impact of this historical trade route by traveling along the ancient Tea Horse Road?

Participants will examine how climate and terrain played a crucial role in the development of the Tea and Horse Road. They will explore how this trade route, often called The Southern Silk Road, shaped the culture and the identity of the region.




Our principles







An unforgettable sight, Tiger Leaping Gorge is one of the world's deepest canyons. Here the mighty Yangtze roars through 34 sets of rapids in just 15 kilometers.

Over the course of two physically challenging days, participants will have the opportunity to hike this legendary trail amidst dramatic snow-capped peaks, bright green countryside and clear blue sky of the valley. At the midway point, far from cities and pollution we will rest in a stunning guesthouse drinking in the serenity as participants will (with luck and good weather) gaze out over one of the most spectacular starscapes one can see in China.

Highlights Cycling in Shaxi

Beautiful on foot, Shaxi is even better on two wheels.

Reach the colorful villages and secret scenic areas of the valley by bike; an absolute must-do activity for groups visiting Shaxi.

Interested participants will be led by our experienced team of guides through winding valley roads, narrow village streets, over lush green fields, and along lazy rivers to some of the best spots in the area.





Cultural Performances

Shaxi has a number of active old theaters, with local musicians and artisans using the creative spaces to share culture with visitors and perform for local residents.

During our time here, will have the opportunity to see and hear traditional performances and music.

Dig deep and learn about the rich history and cultural heritage of former trade stops along The Tea and Horse Road through interactive exchanges and fun activities.

Stays along the old Tea and Horse Caravan route like sleepy Shaxi and Hua Long villages will inspire participants to explore the history of the region and engage with the local residents, getting to know their personal history and about their way of life. Our program will offer participants hands-on opportunities to be immersed in the local culture while learning about the importance of sustainable tourism.
